THE LATINO & LATIN AMERICAN STUDIES MINOR

Providing undergraduate students with enhanced areas of understanding of the culture, history, languages, traditions, and arts of both Latinos in the United States and the people of Latin America. This commitment is designed to prepare students for careers in teaching, government, the media, healthcare, business, law, the arts, and many more.

REQUIREMENTS:
Successful completion of the Latino and Latin American Studies minor consists of satisfying language requirement as well as course requirements.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:
A minimum of one year (two college courses) or equivalent of Spanish.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:
12 credit hours, including the language requirement and a minimum of 3 courses selected from the approved list of courses. Research and social science courses that focus on Latin America, including the list of Humanities and social science courses, include one course in each of the following categories: History, Spanish, and Society, Culture, or other courses that specifically focus on individuals or institutions in the U.S. that of Latin American descent. The minor will require written approval from the Faculty Committee as part of entry registration.
